



How to read a report for Year 7, 8 & 9 students

For each subject, students are given an attitude to learning rating, an attitude to homework rating and twice a year will receive a written comment. The timetable for what to expect each term for each year is below:

Attitude to Learning:

Student's attitude to learning is rated on a 4-point scale:

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High standards for attitude to learning are the norm, so a "Perins Expected Attitude to Learning" rating represents how a student is living up to these standards.

Attitude to Homework:

Student's attitude to homework is also rated on a 4-point scale:

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A consistent level of homework completion and quality are the norm, so a "Perins Expected Attitude to Homework" rating represents how a student is living up to these standards.
