

Our full Privacy Notice is published on the websites of each of our representative organisations. We have provided a summary here which explains the key points of how we use your data. **We will also give relevant privacy information to you wherever we collect data from you.**

What information is being collected?

The data we hold may include pupil details, contact details, assessment results, attendance information, modes of travel, personal characteristics such as ethnic group, any special educational needs and any relevant medical information.

Who is collecting it?

Perins School, acting as a representative of The Perins Multi Academy Trust

How is it collected?

We collect information from pupils and their parents and may also receive information from places such as a pupil's previous school during the admission process

Why is it being collected?

Our requirement for this data and our legal basis for processing includes the Education Act 1996, 2002 and 2011, The Childrens Act 1989 and 2004, Education and Skills Act 2008, Schools Standards and Framework Act 1998 and the Equalities Act 2010.

This means that a school works in the public interest and under Article 6 of the GDPR this is the basis for us processing almost all of the data that we hold.

How will it be used?

- support teaching and learning;
- monitor and report on progress;
- provide appropriate pastoral and medical care;
- contribute to improving health and reducing inequalities;
- undertake statistical forecasting and planning;
- to assess the quality of our services and how well our school is doing;
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing; and
- any other uses will be published in the full notice online

Who will it be shared with?

We do not share personal information with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so. We share pupils' data with the Department for Education (DfE) on a statutory basis. This data sharing underpins school funding and educational attainment policy and monitoring. A list of organisations with whom we share data or who process data on our behalf is available on our website.

What will be the effect of this on the individuals concerned?

Data processing will have a positive impact on student wellbeing, safety and learning

Is the intended use likely to cause individuals to object or complain?

As we are processing most data in the public interest, we don't anticipate any objections. Where we are asking for your consent to use your data, you will have the right to withdraw that consent and ask us to cease processing at any time. Our data protection policy gives details of how we will deal with a complaint.
